Farmington Recycling Program B E G I N S I N D E C E M B E R

The Farmington recycling program will begin in December.

Those residents who are participating in the recycling program will have a blue recycling container dropped off along their street frontage during the month of November. An instructional packet will be attached to the handle of the container informing residents about recycling collection days and what recyclable materials can be placed in the containers. The following are summarized details you will need to know. Be sure and read the full details in the information packet that will be attached to the container handle.

Collection day will be the same day as your regular garbage pickup day BUT every other week. A calendar will be provided in the information packet designating weekly collection cycles by color (blue for one; red for another). Residents will know which cycle they are on.

The next step is easy. Once your container is delivered you can

begin filling it with RECYCLABLES ONLY. Be sure and read the literature to know what is acceptable and what is not.



Wheel your collection container to the curbside on the same day of the week you wheel out your regular garbage, BUT only on your designated recycling week.

IMPROVING STREET SAFETY

The safety of Farmington streets, especially during snowstorms, is the responsibility of all residents. The following tips are a good reminder:

- Don't follow too closely
- Don't pass
- Drive cautiously
- Slow down
- Give plows plenty of room
- Don't blow snow into the street
- Shovel plowed snow into the driveway, onto the park strip, or into the yard




FARMINGTON CITY ORDINANCES:
*compliance improves safety
for everyone*

Farmington City Ordinance states that from November 15 through February 29, no vehicles of any kind may be parked in the street right-of-way from 1:00 am to 7:00 am. Traffic citations will be issued to violators.

City ordinance prohibits the placement of any recreational equipment, building materials, or refuse within the street right-of-way, which generally includes the area between the sidewalk and the pavement surface. Placement of these items could inhibit seasonal services and slow emergency response.

Remember, within 48 hours after snowfall stops, citizens are required to remove snow on the public sidewalks fronting their residences. More snowplow information is available on the city website.



Farmington City takes responsibility for collecting leaves from city trees located in the following areas:

- Main Street from 100 S to 500 N
- State Street from 400 W to 300 E
- 200 W from State to 200 S
- 400 North from Main to 100 E

The sweeper will be in these areas on a regular basis. Residents abutting those streets are invited to sweep leaves into the street. Do not put any sticks or twigs over 6 inches long in the gutter, as such debris plugs the vacuum hose. **If you do not live in these areas, please do not rake your leaves into the street.** More information is available on the city website. Your help and cooperation is appreciated.

Is Thursday your regular garbage pickup day? Thanksgiving Day garbage pickup will be on Friday, November 27. If your regular pickup day falls on Friday, please put your container out as usual, then be patient. Remember, "... if in doubt, put it out."

holiday fire safety tips

maintain your holiday lights Inspect lights each year for frayed wires, bare spots, gaps in the insulation, broken or cracked sockets, and excessive kinking or wear before putting them up. Use only lighting listed by an approved testing laboratory.

do not overload electrical outlets Do not link more than three light strands, unless the directions indicate it is safe. Connect strings of lights to an extension cord before plugging the cord into the outlet. Make sure to periodically check the wires - they should not be warm to the touch.



HOW FARMINGTON CURBSIDE RECYCLING WORKS

- Containers must be used for acceptable recyclable materials (see list on page 5). Recyclables can be co-mingled or mixed together in one container.
- Monthly calendars on page 5 show red and blue weeks. An information packet attached to each recycle container will identify your pickup week as either red or blue. Recyclables will be picked up on the same day as your regular trash day, but every other week.
- Containers should be placed at the curb by 6:00 am or the night before. Remember, routes change from time to time and your container(s) may be some of the first collected that day. By combining recycling collection with the collection of regular garbage pickup, times may be altered.
- Place the container in the street with the wheels against the curb or within 2 feet of the blacktop if no curb exists, with the front of the container facing the street. Containers must be placed 4 feet apart and 8 feet from mailboxes, poles, fences, trees, or parked vehicles for easy access. Do not place containers under low trees or other overhead obstructions.
- Each container has an inventory number which is assigned to a household. Customers are responsible for the containers delivered to their address. The container must remain on your property and be properly cared for. If containers are lost or stolen, the homeowner will be charged for a replacement container (\$50).
- Just like regular garbage pickup, there is no pickup of recyclables on July 4, Memorial Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas, or New Year's Day. If your pickup day falls on one of these holidays, it will be picked up the next day. For those collected on the remaining days of a holiday week, please place your container out on your regular day, then be patient. Garbage collection will be back on schedule as soon as possible.
- Additional recycling containers are available for an additional \$3.85 per month per container. ●


