VETERANS MEMORIAL DEDICATION

11.11.11 at 11:00

A very special event is planned to honor Farmington Veterans and their families. On November 11, Veteran's Day, the new Farmington Veterans Memorial will be dedicated at the Farmington Cemetery. Mayor Scott Harbertson will make welcoming remarks, followed by an American



Legion flag ceremony. James Hansen, former congressman and Navy veteran, and Lieutenant Governor and former mayor Greg Bell will speak. The monument will stand as a memorial to Farmington veterans' spirit, sacrifice, and commitment. A special invitation is extended to all veterans and their families and to all Farmington residents to join in the dedication on 11.11.11 at 11:00 am.

PROPER WASTE DISPOSAL

Are you aware that storm drain inlets in your street are connected to pipes that run directly to streams throughout the community or to the wetlands of the Great Salt Lake without any type of treatment to remove contaminants? For this reason, it is important that nothing goes down the drain except storm water.

Some items that should never enter the storm drain are:

Dirt from landscaping projects, including installation of sprinklers. Any dirt in the street, gutter, or on top of the curb should be cleaned up daily during landscaping projects.

Household wastes including used oil, paints, antifreeze, gasoline and other chemicals. Oil can be dropped off at the public works building for recycling.

FARMINGTON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Ensuring Those with Special Needs are Not Overlooked During Emergencies

The Farmington City Fire Department is in the process of building a database of all community members with special needs. In the event of medical emergencies, long-term power outages or large-scale incidents involving evacuations, the fire department wants to ensure it is prepared to address special needs by proactively collecting information. If you or family members have special needs and you reside in Farmington or areas serviced by Farmington Emergency Services, please contact DeAnn Carlile (801) 939-9261, or email dcarlile@farmington.utah.gov and provide the following:

first & last name	date of birth	physical address	email address	telephone
names & telephone numbers of two alternate family members				
medical conditions – ex: severe vision, hearing, or physical impairments to include other medical conditions restricting the ability to receive emergency notifications or evacuate the home / workplace under self-power				
special needs – ex: ventilator dependent, power supply dependent, critical medications or other needs necessary to sustain life over an extended period of time (up-to 96 hours) without regular services				
interest you may have in joining a special needs emergency planning committee to further develop and enhance emergency services				

Please note this is a voluntary program only. All information provided shall remain confidential and only be used in conjunction with the application of emergency services and related training.

PARK LANE VILLAGE APARTMENTS

Construction on the Park Lane Village Apartments, directly off the confluence of I-15, Legacy Highway and Highway 89, began in June. Park Lane Village is the open-




ing phase of a new transit-oriented, mixed-use, 90-acre Park Lane Commons. This rental community will have 324 units in five, three-story buildings. The project has direct pedestrian access to the Farmington Front-Runner Station, Station Park, and to the Legacy Trail. Farmington officials believe the Park Lane Apartments will complement existing and future development and add a progressive element to the city.

WINTER ORDINANCES

Farmington City Ordinance states that from November 15 through February 29, no vehicles of any kind may be parked in the street right-of-way from 1:00 am to 7:00 am. Traffic citations will be issued to violators.

Also, remember that within 48 hours after snowfall stops, citizens are required to remove snow on the public sidewalks fronting their residences. More snowplow information is available on the city website.

Wasatch Integrated Waste Management District handles the proper disposal of other products. The drop-off location is 650 East Highway 193 in Layton, phone 801-614-5600.

Other things that should be kept out of the storm drain include grass cuttings (sweep the curb after mowing), car washing detergent and dirt (wash your car on your lawn or at a commercial carwash), fertilizer (sweep or blow any fertilizer that gets on the driveway, sidewalk or street back into the yard), and trash (clean out your gutters occasionally).

Lets all do our part to prevent contamination of the fresh waters around Farmington. 🌱

Arielle Simpson is quick to credit her mother with her initial decision to enter the pageant world by running for Miss Farmington. When she was crowned the winner in 2010, she chose a platform that honored her mother's ongoing battle with cancer: Hope for Life. During Arielle's year of reign, not only did her platform broaden from its initial focus exclusively on cancer patients to include families and friends of victims of cancer, it also became intensely personal as Arielle watched her mother succumb to the ravages of the disease.

With a spirit of optimism she inherited from her mother, Arielle has embraced her experiences, transformed challenges into strength, and opened her heart to the pain of others.

Here's a glimpse into the life of Arielle Simpson.

You were crowned Miss Farmington in 2010. What made you decide to run?

Actually, the scholarship. I finished high school, and I was like okay, now what? We got a newsletter in the mail, and my mom was like why don't you do this? I thought, Pageants, what are you talking about? Like I could do pageants! But it just took off from there.

Girls selected to be Miss Farmington really do have an influence on our community. What was your platform?

My platform started out with just breast cancer awareness, but it turned into hope for life, supporting families affected by cancer. There

are millions of people who have to deal with loved ones with cancer. So I came up with a mentoring process that helped people cope.

Do you mind talking a bit about how the issue upon which your platform focused has affected you personally?

My mom actually passed away six months ago from breast cancer. It was during my year of reign, which was just a turning point. It turned out that my platform was perfect for myself. People are always like, you don't understand my situation. And I'm like, yeah, I do. I've lived through it, breathed it. I've tried to take care of my family. Figuring out how to live. Figuring out how to

move on. I was expecting my mom to be with me during my whole year of reign. I was expecting my mom to come with me to Miss Utah. It didn't turn out that way. Miss Utah was two months after her death.

That must have been incredibly sad and difficult.

I'm trying to figure out, can I still go [to Miss Utah]? Can I handle all these other girls with their moms, watching that? I had to actually sit myself down and ask what am I going to do? I knew that years down the road I was going to look back at this and ask, why didn't I do that? Why didn't I do a once in a life opportunity just because a tragedy happened? Tragedies happen all around the world and people still push through. I'm going to be that person who pushes through and lives with my platform and lives through my platform.

It must have been so challenging to participate in the Miss Utah pageant without your mom there to support you.

[Yes, but] my dad came to every single night of that pageant. He actually wore my mom's pageant mom pin. My dad was critical in my pushing through that. He's just been critical in me getting through this.

You must have extremely strong parents.

My family has really taken a different role on. We've really come together and bonded. You take a tragedy and take the positives out of anything. [My mom] had cancer for 17 years. That's nearly half of her life. She smiled her whole way through it. That's kind of what I've taken out of it. It's like hey, you think about a situation and you smile.

Arielle Simpson is a survivor in the best sense of the word. Her grief has grown into a resolve to listen, to love, and ease the burdens of others. She is a willing friend to anyone struggling to cope with the impact of cancer. Please feel free to contact her at arielle.simpson@aggiemail.usu.edu.
