Budget Process Begins

The City is now gathering information concerning the City's budgeting needs for the fiscal year 2005-2006. Citizen input is essential at this time to allow for greater flexibility in the budgeting process.

A budget will be proposed to the Mayor and City Council about the first of May. During May, the City Council and Mayor review the budget in detail, then a Budget Hearing is scheduled for June to receive additional input.

Residents with specific Budget concerns should speak with Mayor Connors, any member of the City Council or the City Manager prior to May 1, 2005.

TRAIL NEWS

Dyer's Woad is a tall noxious weed with yellow flowers that grows profusely on our mountains and fields. It has spread to Idaho and Wyoming and into the Wasatch Range. It takes moisture from the soil depriving the native plants.

Other yellow wildflowers exist so learn to recognize the Woad seen in the photo. Color photos and information are available about the weed at Farmington City Hall. Everyone is encouraged to pull the whole Woad plants including the root, and it is easiest when the soil is moist. They can be left on the ground if the flowers are still attached. If the flowers are absent, the entire plant must be removed from the site.

ATTENTION: Hazardous Waste Oil Drop Off Regulations Noted

Farmington City provides residents a service by collecting used oil free of charge at the Public Works Building 700 N. 100 W. **DROP OFFS CAN ONLY BE MADE DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS** as personnel are available to help. Never leave oil unattended.

Recently residents have been dumping oil on roads, leaving it in containers around town and after hours at the door of the Public Works Building. Oil is considered a hazardous material and fines up to \$10,000 can be imposed for leaving oil unattended. Please be conscientious when dropping off oil.
