

SPECIAL FARMINGTON CITY COUNCIL MEETING

October 7, 2005 - 8:00 a.m.

Farmington City Hall, 130 North Main Street

Present: Mayor David M. Connors, Council Members Larry Haugen and Susan Holmes. Council Member Sid Young participated in the meeting via the telephone. Also present were Margy Lomax, City Recorder, Michael Cragun, State of Utah Elections Director, and Marie McKenna from Box Elder County Clerk's Office.

Mayor Connors called the meeting to order at 8:15 a.m. The purpose for the special meeting was to canvass the election results of the Farmington City Primary Election held October 4, 2005.

Canvass of Election

Margy Lomax, City Recorder, reported the numbers had changed slightly from the totals reported on election night. The reason for the difference in numbers was due to counting "provisional ballots" which had been cast. There had been 33 ballots cast; but only 21 were certified to be counted. The other 12 ballots were cast by individuals who were not registered voters.

A chart was given to those present showing which candidates received additional votes. Mayor Connors read the totals of all the candidates to Council Member Young who was participating by speaker phone during the meeting. There were no additional changes to the election tally.

A motion was made by **Susan Holmes** to accept the results of the Primary Election as had been presented to them and to declare them as the official election results for the Farmington City Primary Election held on October 4, 2005. The motion was seconded by **Larry Haugen** with Council Members Holmes, Haugen and Young voting in the affirmative the motion passed.

Michael Cragun thanked the Mayor and Council for using the new Diebold electronic voting machines for the election. Farmington City was the only city in the State using the machines for their election. The process went very well and the public was very receptive of the new method of voting. Farmington City and Brigham City will be the only cities using them for the General Election.

There being no further business to bring before the Council, upon motion of **Larry Haugen** with a second by **Susan Holmes**, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 a.m.
