

check out the new PARKS AMENITIES APP

As part of Farmington City's continuous effort to make life more rewarding for its citizens, a parks amenities app has been created by the GIS/IT department. This app allows you to access an interactive parks map that can be used to search a wide range of information about city parks. You can use the search bar to find parks by name or by facilities, i.e. tennis, basketball, bowery etc. You can use the toggles on the left to filter parks by facilities or view all parks and facilities in table form by clicking the arrow at the bottom of the screen.

 - > select 'Farmington City Parks'




CROSSING GUARD SIGN-UP INCENTIVES

SAFE EXCHANGE ZONE


The Farmington Police Department provides a safe exchange zone for residents and visitors in need of such a service. Two well-lit, 24 hours/day stalls are located in the police department parking lot at 286 South 200 East. These stalls are within a few feet of the police department's front doors and are under 24-hour recorded video surveillance. As shown in the photo above, the designated stalls are each marked with a sign. The safe exchange is meant for the sole purpose of offering a safe place to exchange kids between parents or conduct personal transactions. HEATH WOLF

*"Work hard,
play with passion,
and have fun."*

Sometimes plan B is better than plan A. Heath Wolf's career is a fantastic example: After learning percussion from a school band director in rural Colorado, Heath set out to the University of Utah with high hopes. "My plan was always to be a performer," he admits. "I was getting my degree in music education simply because if performing didn't work out, I would at least have a way to make a living."

As luck would have it, Heath developed severe tendinitis after completing his undergraduate degree. He then realized he had to set aside his initial plan and resort to becoming a band teacher.

But anyone who has sent a teenager to Farmington Jr. High equipped with an instrument case knows that Mr. Wolf is more than an ordinary band teacher. Throughout the year, he teaches over three hundred students as he directs three bands and three ensembles. Since he began his career, Heath has earned over fifteen awards for his teaching and has also sought unique performance opportunities for his students—the most recent being the Jazz Ensemble's trip to Chicago's Midwest Clinic in December.

Heath admits, however, that receiving recognition is not the best part of his job. He explains, "The most rewarding teaching moments occur in our band room, when that passage of music we have been working on forever finally comes together. When that kid who has struggled with a concept gets it. When there is a goose bumps moment because we just created a magical thirty seconds of time that can't be explained, only experienced."

Heath tries to spread this perspective through the Farmington band motto: Work hard, play with passion, and have fun. He hopes that as the students live by the motto during their music education, they will learn how to flourish. Because a good work ethic can be an asset in most stages of life, Heath passionately claims that "students will be successful at whatever they choose to pursue if they know how to work without receiving instant gratification. That is one of

the greatest lessons studying a musical instrument teaches."

But, as the two latter parts of the motto imply, it's also important to remember that these students are still kids. Over recent years, Heath has noticed that kids today are facing intense pressure. He says, "They are in such a hurry to grow up, and society is continually quickening that pace. I wish we would just give them time to be kids."

Yet perhaps the kids in the bands are learning to kill two birds with one stone as they work hard while enjoying the music with their friends. Because of this example to young students of fun and passionate work, Farmington is grateful Heath chose his plan B.
