wide and will have 32 columns to hold up the roof. It will take 1,100 cubic yards of concrete to build the tank; it took 39 full concrete trucks to make the floor. Each wall section is stabilized with four 7-ton blocks. The forms used to build the walls come in 24-foot sections and each section weighs 14,000 pounds. The front of the tank will be exposed, but the back will be buried into the mountain.

Farmington City has contracted with Gerber Construction to build a 2,000,000-gallon culinary water tank, engineered by Hansen, Allen & Luce. The new tank, which has been in the planning stages for the past fifteen years, will replace a 100,000-gallon tank, which will be demolished.

Before purchasing this property, the city considered several other properties that were found to be problematic due to the fault line or other issues.

Walls of the new tank are 20 feet high and about 1 foot thick. It is 134 feet

The city has a total of 9 reservoirs that store a total of 8,500,000 gallons of water. Stored water is used for fire protection as well as household use. On average, Farmington residents use about 2,000,000 gallons of culinary water each day.

When Bob Aamodt, a Farmington native, bought the historic Grover home located at 630 North Main Street, in 2006, he did so for a variety of reasons: his love of Farmington, his own family's link to Farmington's rich history, and his vision of a new life and purpose for the simple rock home that had stood the decades since 1880.

It had been originally built by Walter Grover as a special gift for his beloved mother, Elizabeth Walker Grover. Elizabeth was the sixth plural wife of Thomas Grover, and during most of the years she was raising her four children she never had a home of her own. Her loving son, Walter, received permission from his father to build the home for her.

Walter hauled timber from Farmington Canyon, rocks from the foothills, and clay from the shores of the Great Salt Lake to build the home. With some help from a hired stonemason, Walter performed most of the labor himself.

Elizabeth lived in the home until 1886. Her husband passed away and she moved to Logan. The home has had numerous renters and owners over the years with some additions being made.

Bob Aamodt's 11-month labor of love on the historic home resulted in the restoration and preservation of one of Farmington's treasures, and then became the new site for Rock House Financial. The Farmington City Historic Preservation Commission recognized his efforts, and the home is listed on the Farmington Historic Landmarks Register.

Mr. Aamodt first opened the home to the public in May of 2008, and since that time many of the Grover descendants have had the privilege to tour the home and renew the appreciation for its rich heritage.

CHECK YOURSELF AGAINST THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES.

Have your trash container at curbside by 6:00am on collection day. Pickup times may vary.

Place your container at curbside, facing the street. Do not place your can on top of the curb. For those without a curb, place it within two feet off the blacktop.

Do not place the container near parked vehicles. When dumping your container, the driver must have clear access to it.

Do not place the container where it will block delivery of your mail.

If you have two or more containers, place them four feet apart.

Do not place the following items in your trash container: hot ashes or coals, large quantities of dirt, sod, rocks or concrete, flammable materials, large bulky items, construction, remodeling, or demolition debris.

Do not place item of length greater than four feet in the container.

Please remove your container off the street by the end of the day.


