
## MESSAGE FROM MAYOR TALBOT

out later on summer nights and sometimes neglect to think about the noise they're making that might be bothering neighbors.

**Q: SIDEWALK REPAIR**  
The sidewalk in front of my house has a broken section that needs to be replaced. It is my understanding that sidewalks are located in the public right-of-way. Am I responsible to find a contractor and pay for replacing the concrete?

**A:** Property owners, along with the city, are responsible for the sidewalk along their frontage. The city is willing to share 50% of the cost to replace settled or broken sidewalks that create a trip hazard within the public street right-of-way. Farmington City has a limited budget for sidewalks, so if you are interested in taking advantage of this opportunity, please call Farmington Public Works right away at 801-451-2624. A city representative will meet with you to inspect and mark those sections of sidewalk

in need of replacement. The cost will be determined by the street superintendent and a qualified contractor who has been retained by the city to remove and replace sidewalk sections. Sidewalks replaced by this contractor will meet city standard, which is 6 inches thick with fiber added to the concrete to help prevent future breakage. The work will be accomplished this fall and next spring.
