Do you love Farmington? Here's an idea to help you instill that love in your family. The Farmington City Historic Preservation Commission will be hosting walking tours of the city's two nationally recognized historic districts in its downtown area: Clark Lane Historic District, and the Main Street Historic District.

The tour for the Main Street District will be Monday, May 11th, and will start at the historic LDS Rock Chapel parking lot at 272 North Main Street at 6:00 pm. The tour of the Clark Lane District will be Monday, May 18th, starting at the historic Davis County Memorial Courthouse parking lot, on the south-east corner of State and Main streets, at 6:00 pm.

Please arrive a little early so the tours can begin on time. The tour host will be Tia Uzelac. She and some of the homeowners will share information about the historic homes and sites seen along the way. Please come join us and learn more about our rich Farmington heritage.

Thirty-eight years ago, Farmington's tranquil atmosphere and friendly people enticed Ann Dale and her husband Rob to move here. Farmington was forever improved by their decision. "I cherish the goodness of Farmington citizens and the beauty that is found in every neighborhood. I feel blessed to have my three daughters and all of our grandchildren living close by," Ann says.


In 1971, Ann began a twenty-nine year career as a social worker for Davis School District. She was a pioneer in the early years of alternative education and in 1974 led the establishment of a successful program for high school moms. Later, she helped develop a new program for emotionally fragile youth at Canyon Heights.

The Dales, while raising their own children, took in several refugee families from Laos or Vietnam. They also fostered many children—some for a short time, some for years and some who are still a part of their family. Ann's daughter Wendy remembers that each evening, not long after Ann got home from work, "We'd hear the sound of the news starting, and smell ground beef and onions sizzling. She cooked dinner for us every night."

Ann is a community-builder. She was instrumental in starting the first softball teams for Farmington girls and also in bringing tennis to north Farmington. She single-handedly lobbied the city to put in four tennis courts off Shepard Lane.

"Frequently, while shopping, Mom handed me a ten dollar bill or a

With apparent limitless energy, friends might say Ann's life is defined by service. According to her thirteen grandchildren, Ann is "the very best grandma that ever was." In addition to the time and energy it takes to achieve that title, Ann leads the Lifting Lives Foundation, a foundation that provides full support to children who live in an orphan home in Kenya, a home constructed by Farmington donors. Ann travels to Kenya every year, leading local individuals on a meaningful service experience.

Ann is grateful to all those who have made the Farmington event, *Run For Africa*, such a success. Now in its sixth year, organizers are watching news on COVID19 and holding off on scheduling for now. Keep
