SPRING CLEANUP 2016

a message from Mayor Jim Talbot

Without a doubt, the citizens of Farmington are Davis County's BIG winners! As we all pruned, cut down, cleaned out tree limbs and leaves and began beautifying our lawns and yards for the months ahead, Farmington City picked up this debris as a service for us. And why does this make us winners? The answer is . . . we are unique in Farmington because we offer this service to our citizens at no extra cost. Most other cities in our county do not do this for their citizens. Who makes this all possible for Farmington? For years the city council has prioritized and approved this in the city's financial budget to help beautify our city. This massive project of removing unwanted green waste takes three weeks of Public Works staff time to haul the debris off to the Central Davis




Sewer District. There it is processed and resold as compost and decorative bark for our yards and landscape planters. Other cities scratch their heads in wonder as to how Farmington continues to make this service avail-

able to our citizens—a perk which we might be losing if city residents don't follow the rules associated with this service. Earlier this year in the Farmington newsletter, the rules were clearly explained. The majority of our citizens know and review the rules each year. As a whole, the city had to tag 78 residences with yellow warning tags for violations dealing with the pickup. After adhering to the pickup criteria, these piles were eventually picked up. Another 33 residents were in gross violation and given orange tags. These piles never did comply and were not picked up. A word to the wise, if you want this service to continue, please abide by its rules. We want this program to continue.

“There was a total of 552 loads dropped off—305 loads from the north half of Farmington and 247 loads from the south half. As a comparison, last year we picked up a total of 292 loads total throughout Farmington.”


In March of 2015, Farmington and Kaysville cities were awarded a joint Local Planning Resource match grant by Wasatch Front Regional Council to perform a regional active transportation plan.



Active transportation is any mode of transportation that does not involve the car, predominantly focused on bikes and pedestrian travel. Farmington City felt that active transportation plays an important role in an efficient and equitable transportation system, adds to the fabric of an economically vibrant community, and provides basic mobility, affordable

PRESCRIPTION DRUG DROP BOX

Unwanted or expired medications can be safely disposed of at a drop box located at the Farmington Police Department. This type of disposal helps reduce drug misuse, prevent accidental ingestion by children or animals, and minimize effects on the environment.

The prescription drug drop box is available Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00am to 5:00pm, except holidays.

Please note that the service provided is for prescription or over-the-counter medications. **DO NOT** leave syringes, batteries or toxic chemicals. In addition, the police request that pills be left in the original or similar containers, with or without the label, inside of a sealed bag. Bags are available if needed.

transportation, access to transit, physical fitness and enjoyment. Improving active conditions benefits users and non-users in such ways as less congestion, better air, stronger community, increased "walkability", etc.

The two cities selected Alta Planning + Design as the consultant firm to complete the plan. From the outset, public involvement was a priority with the planning team, and a steering committee was assembled consisting of various stakeholders at all levels of the community. The Alta team also created a website with an interactive map where visitors could edit the map and make recommendations. The website also had a survey and over 1,000 respondents provided information to help guide the plan. As was advertised in Farmington News, an open house was held at the new Kaysville City Library where the public came and reviewed the plans and gave input on what kinds of active transportation improvements they would like to see.

Based on a detailed analysis of the existing conditions done through the survey, open house, crash data, and fieldwork, the final plan gives detailed recommendations on the various types of active transportation improvements. These included different types of on-street facilities ranging from painted bike lanes to buffered bike lanes, to more intense shared use trails. Traffic signals, signs, and safety measures were recommended at strategic locations. The plan was adopted by the Farmington City Council on March 15th, as part of the city's General Plan. This plan will guide the city in its transportation development into the future and has already proven fruitful as it is being used in obtaining several different grants.
