The Golden Spoke network is complete, now connecting multi-use trails, including Ogden River Parkway, Denver and Rio Grande Western Rail Trail (funded gap), Legacy Trail, Jordan River Trail, Murdock Canal Trail, and Provo River Parkway—linking Ogden and Provo.

On June 2nd, simultaneously, one group will begin a bike ride at Rainbow Gardens in Ogden Canyon, traveling south (~47 miles); another group will begin their bike ride at Palisade Park in Orem and travel north (~57 miles). Community members are invited to join the bike groups at multiple points along the trail for a shorter ride, run or walk. The two groups will converge in the center of the connected trails at the new Jordan River Bridge near North Temple in Salt Lake City. A celebration event with guest speakers, food trucks, and family-friendly activities will be held at the Fisher Mansion, 1206 West 200 South in Salt Lake City.

things to think about

SPOT IMPOSTORS: scammers may pretend to be someone you trust. Don't send money or give out personal information whether it comes as a text, a phone call, or an email.

DON'T BELIEVE YOUR CALLER ID: if someone calls asking for money or personal information, hang up. If you think the caller might be telling the truth, call back to a number you know is genuine.

BE SKEPTICAL ABOUT FREE TRIAL OFFERS: some companies use free trials to sign you up for products and bill you every month until you cancel.

DO ONLINE SEARCHES: type a company or product name into a search engine with words like "review," "complain" or "scam." You can even search for phone numbers to see if other people have reported them as scams.
