The **WEB.COM TOUR** at Oakridge Country Club June 24-30, 2019 — Kid's Golf Clinic June 28

The Utah Championship, presented by Zions Bank and hosted by the Utah Sports Commission, takes place the week of June 24 – 30, in Farmington at Oakridge Country Club. This marks its 28th year in partnership with the PGA TOUR.

The Utah Championship is one of the original tournaments of the 1990 Ben Hogan Tour, now known as the Web.com Tour. Several past tournament champions have graduated to successful careers on the PGA TOUR, including the inaugural Utah Championship winner John Daly who went on to win the 1991 PGA Championship and the 1995 British Open. Zach Johnson, winner of the 2003 Utah Championship, has won

the 2007 Masters and the 2015 British Open.

Most recently, Cameron Champ (2018) took the golf world by storm in just his second start as a PGA TOUR member by immediately winning the Sanderson Farms Championship, only two months after receiving his PGA TOUR card.

The Utah Championship offers more than golf. It also endeavors to raise money for the tournament's charitable partners along with contributing to the PGA TOUR's unprecedented success in giving back to local charities. The tournament has made donations to the following charitable

TWO RATE INCREASES WILL IMPROVE SERVICES TO FARMINGTON CONSUMERS

NEW REGULATIONS WILL REDUCE PHOSPHORUS

Central Davis Sewer District is implementing a \$3.00 per month increase in sewer treatment fees. This increase will pay the costs to meet new state-mandated regulations reducing phosphorus through increased biosolids production and handling. The last rate increase was implemented in 2015.

WASATCH INTEGRATED ANNOUNCES NEW WASTE SORTING SYSTEM

Wasatch Integrated Waste Management District (Wasatch) has announced construction of a new Davis Materials Recovery Facility and Transfer Station at the site of the former Davis Energy Recovery Facility (burn plant) which closed in May 2017. The new facility includes a state-of-the-art solid waste processing system and transfer station to serve the waste disposal and recycling needs of Davis and Morgan Counties for the foreseeable future.

Wasatch has always focused on environmental performance, primarily through the operation of the Davis Energy Recovery Facility which converted a portion of our waste into energy. Closure of the energy recovery facility is placing a higher demand on the Davis Landfill which will now, without a change to the system, reach capacity within twenty years. The new processing system will once again allow a substantial amount of waste diversion from the landfill.

To support the financing and operation of the new system, the administrative control board of Wasatch has approved an increase in the monthly household use fee. The initial fee, implemented in 1995, was \$10 per can per month. Over the years, the fee was reduced several times to the current \$5.20 per can per month. **Effective July 1, 2019, the household use fee will increase by \$2.00 per can per month, bringing it to \$7.20.**

The new facilities are currently under construction and are anticipated to be fully operational in early 2020. The new waste management system will substantially increase the life of the Davis Landfill as well as reduce odors associated with landfill operation, increase recycling rates in our community and extract and create other useful resources from our waste.

BRENT STEPHENS RETIRING AFTER 32 YEARS WITH DSD

Twenty-seven of Brent Stephens' thirty-two years in education have been spent at Farmington Junior High. Thousands of students have known and loved him as their history or geography teacher, as an administrator or, for the past nine years, as their principal. The mention of his name usually brings a smile to those faces . . . *oh I love Mr. Stephens.* We recently had a chance to catch up with this busy man in his office to have a conversation about his distinguished career.

Here are some of the things he had to say.

Q: Do you have a philosophy for working with junior high students?

Brent: No, not really. I just think kids know when you care about them. When you enjoy working with them they feel it. You can't fake it.

Q: What's the biggest change you've seen during your years in education?

Brent: Probably the biggest change is a change in attitude. Back when I started, a teacher could discipline a student or give an appropriate grade and the parents would almost always back up the teacher and try to be there to help the student. There are still plenty of parents who are

supportive, but some parents want to make everything so easy for their kids, don't want to let them face anything difficult. That becomes challenging for educators.

Q: Are there other things that are new in education?

Brent: One thing I really like is the SafeUT app, which was developed at the University of Utah to help with mental health issues, with bullying incidents, with school shootings. Kids know that if they have an issue they can anonymously contact a counselor and bring to light whatever they're experiencing. It's a great tool and in this day and age when kids are using their cell phones more and more, it's something they feel they can use.

There are also some funny things that happen with the app. We had a student report that a teacher got angry in class and yelled. Some reports are more credible than others. We investigate them all and it keeps us busy.

Q: You're retiring at the end of this school year. What are your plans?

Brent: My wife Alane and I have four daughters and three grandchildren. Two daughters are married, one recently returned from an LDS mis-

sion and is now at Utah State and one is currently on a mission in Canada. We plan to spend at least a year here and at our place in St. George, visit the kids and do a little bit of traveling until our youngest daughter returns home. Then we'd like to go on a mission ourselves.

Q: What are you going to miss the most about coming to school each day?

Brent: I will miss the kids and I will miss working with the teachers. Although, I see five or ten people I know every time I go to the grocery store. I have taught thousands of students. I can't even go to Disneyland without seeing someone I know. I've always enjoyed that.
