LEGAL NOTICE CITY OF FARMINGTON 2015 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

This notice is to inform residents of the City of Farmington that there will be a municipal election this year for the following offices:

3 City Council positions
(4 year term)

January 2016 – January 2020

The constitutional and statutory qualification requirements for municipal office are:

- 1 Be a United States citizen
- 2 The person is a registered voter in the municipality
- 3 The person will be at least 18 years old at the time of the next election
- 4 The person has been a legal resident of the municipality for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election
- 5 Any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to vote or hold elective office is restored as provided by statute

PLEASE NOTE:
Rules will be strictly enforced

Each residence is restricted to one 10-wheel dump truck load or a pile size approximately 10' long, 6' wide & 4' high

Limbs stacked in the same direction allows for increased volume in the pile

Materials must be placed at the curb line BEFORE beginning collection day.

Collection trucks will ONLY drive by homes ONCE

No bags or boxes - leaves can be left in piles

Must be stacked maximum length 5', maximum width 8"

COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Monday March 23rd-
 south half of the city from 600 North to city limits, including west Farmington area

Monday March 30th-
 north half of the city from 600 North to city limits, including Oakridge area

DISPOSAL

Material is mulched at the Central Davis Sewer District Treatment Plant

Street sweeping will be done after spring cleanup is completed. The sweeper cannot pick up limbs or twigs over 6" long because they plug the vacuum hose.

AFTER CLEANUP IS DONE, PLEASE RAKE UP THE LIMBS AND TWIGS IN YOUR GUTTER AND THROW THEM IN YOUR GARBAGE CAN.

This will help the street sweeper be more efficient.




Loving Life in Farmington

John and Iris Cox are long-time residents of Farmington. John was born in England and Iris in Canada. They have traveled the world and made humanitarian contributions all along the way. Married for fifty years, a son and daughter grown, the couple could live in a place of their choosing. And they choose Farmington.

Life for John and Iris changed when John, working as an aeronautical engineer for British Airways, was asked by the LDS church to leave England and relocate to Utah to work in temporal affairs, international welfare and humanitarian services for the church. And so in 1983, without knowing much about Farmington and under tight time constraints, John and Iris found a new, vacant home on Farmington's Compton bench. Iris recalls, "We were impressed by the countrified village atmosphere of the then-small town. And it still has that small town feel." In two hours, they decided upon the home, went to a bank to finance a mortgage and then headed to the airport to fly back to England and prepare for the move. Decades later, they do not regret the quick decision they made so long ago.

Farmington is home.

John, now retired, enjoys the ability to spend more time pursuing his love of photography. He sees beauty in the landscapes around him and is able to capture that beauty. John has an impressive collection of work.

Iris grew up in Quebec, the eighth child in a family of ten siblings. She graduated with a degree in Arts and Education and has taught school in Canada, England and in the U.S. In the early '60s, Iris and a friend traveled to England to live for a year. By a twist of fate Iris met John and fell in love. They were married in 1965. While raising their children and traveling with John when possible, Iris also developed an interest in natural healing modalities. Over the years, she has taken the opportunity to study and practice methods of natural therapy that have been developed by doctors and psychiatrists. Currently she has a practice, treating clients from her home. A

cancer survivor herself, Iris understands the mental and physical stress illness can cause. Some of Iris's clients are patients referred to her by her own oncologist. Iris enjoys the work and has been successful in helping people cope with their fear and pain.

Hiking the Farmington trails and attending community theater are two of the local activities John and Iris enjoy. Now living in central Farmington, they are actively pursuing their work and hobbies. They volunteer for Davis School District judging science fairs, and Iris teaches reading to

elementary school children. They enjoy people and are thankful that their journey brought them here to be surrounded by the many friends they have made over the years.

The statutory filing period is between June 1 and June 7. Because June 7, 2015, falls on a Sunday, the filing period will be extended to June 8, 2015. Interested parties may file for office during normal office hours at the Farmington City Recorder's Office at 160 South Main Street.

The general election will be held on Tuesday, November 3rd. If sufficient candidates file, a primary election will be held on Tuesday, August 11th.
