WILDLIFE ON THE FARMINGTON TRAILS



Spring is a great time to enjoy the wonderful Farmington trails. Spring is also when animals come out of their dens, search for food, breed and rear young.

WILDLIFE SAFETY TIPS TO KEEP IN MIND:

Be alert at dawn and dusk when wildlife is more active.

Stay on designated trails.

Hike, jog or bike with a companion.

Keep dogs on a leash and in sight.

Be alert and avoid placing yourself between a mother and her offspring.

If you encounter wildlife do not crowd the animal.
Give it a clear escape route.

WILDLIFE HIGHLIGHT:

Coyotes are abundant in Utah and play an important role in the ecosystem. They are curious animals and will normally watch humans and pets from a distance.

COYOTE SAFETY TIPS:

Keep your distance and do not allow your dogs to “play” with coyotes.

Let coyotes know you are in the area by talking loudly, whistling or making noise, helping them move away from you.

If a coyote approaches you or your pet, pick up small pets, make loud noises, stomp your feet, and throw rocks or sticks if necessary to frighten the coyote away.

Do not run or turn your back on a coyote that has approached you. Face the coyote, shout at it, be as big as possible, wave your arms and back away slowly.

If you have an encounter with aggressive wildlife, please alert the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources (UDWR) at 801-476-2740. If the encounter occurs after hours please call your local sheriff’s office, who can contact a conservation office to handle the situation.

FARMINGTON CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT EXPANDS SERVICES

Farmington firefighters recently completed vigorous Ice Rescue Instructor and Technician certification courses enabling its members to better save victims who have fallen through the ice.



Farmington is now one of three fire departments—with Layton & Syracuse—capable of performing ice rescues within Davis County. Together these departments will work as a task force team during ice rescue emergencies throughout the county.



The new ice rescue equipment is placed aboard an ex-military 4-wheel drive Special Response Vehicle. This vehicle was acquired with grant funds, which significantly reduced the program costs to the city.



Local police officers will also receive ice rescue awareness training to better assist rescue teams during emergent events.
