Ezra T. Clark Home

- Andrew Clark reviewed proposed plans for Clark historic home restoration. Showed drawings of front and back views, and explained the additions. Described how possible earthquake protection would be done. Very costly. Final paperwork for the roof has not been submitted to the state at this day, but deadline approaches for work to be done. Certificate of Historical Appropriateness cannot be completed at this time. Home is currently 174 years old.

Historic Sites List

- We had previous plans to do an audit of homes on our existing List, but we will be using the Utah State Preservation Office Historic Sites Map and List for Farmington, instead. It is more complete and includes Lagoon's historic rides and buildings. It was last updated on April 13, 2021.
- Their map shows homes to the north that could be included in the Main Street Historic District. That project is still up for debate, and is on the back burner.
- Andrew would like to be a liaison to Lagoon because of his concern for the Pioneer Village buildings and collections. He would also like to work with them to find solutions to Lagoon owned historic homes and rentals on Main Street and Clark Lane that need attention. The commission members would like to do a tour of Pioneer Village and assess the situation.
